

CARES Act FINAL Quarterly Report October -December 2020: Jan 4, 2021

Bais Medrash Heichal Dovid has signed and returned the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than 50 percent of the funds received under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

Bais Medrash Heichal Dovid has received a total of \$48,441 from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

Bais Medrash Heichal Dovid has disbursed \$48,500 to 69 students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of November 13, 2020, with \$9 of institutional funds added to the Section 18004(a)(1) allocation.

The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is 69*.

***This number applies to the Spring 2020 and Summer 2020 does not include the Title IV eligible students who enrolled in Fall 2020 who were not identified in the institution's method of allocation for grants awarded in Fall 2020.**

The method used by Bais Medrash Heichal Dovid to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive is based on the expenses for food, course material, equipment needed to participate in the educational program due to the disruption of campus operations, travel home expenses and health care related expenses which has been calculated at \$50 for a dependent student \$3,500 for an independent student. A few independent students received an additional grant of \$3500 in the Fall 2020 semester.

Students received the following instructions with their grants: "As per the CARES Act, these grants are to be used for expenses that are related to the disruption of campus operations due to COVID-19, including things like course materials and technology as well as food, housing, health care, and childcare."
